If a board member was appointed to a position due to a resignation of a school board member, that person is required to run in the next election for the remaining years of that particular seat. Incumbents Stacy Gasperich and Mike Bjork were both appointed due to resignations. Mike Bjork is running for the balance of a term that ends in 2020. Stacy Gasperich is running for the balance of a term that ends in 2022. Stacy Gasperich and Mike Bjork are running unopposed. There are three candidates running for two, six year seats. The candidates are Troy Margoni and incumbents Debra
